



### Spring into Action at 'The Gates'

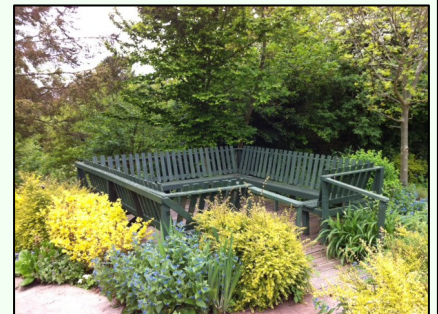
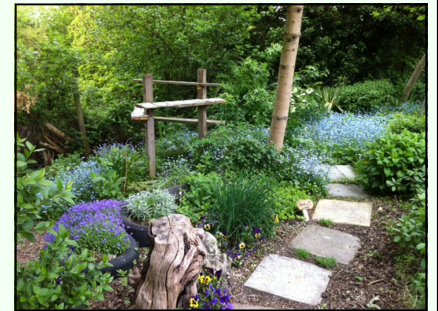

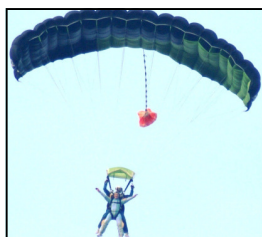
